PREPARING FOR THE SACRAMENTS

Next week we begin our Sacramental Preparation time with the children and their families who have registered to prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Eucharist. At this stage there are over 60 children registered for preparation.

Preparation for the sacraments has changed over the years.

The process once relied on preparing the children for a moment in their lives at a certain age rather than preparing them for a way of life that is fueled by the sacraments, celebrated within a Catholic Christian community. The sacraments are no longer seen as “holy things” acquired along the way, to be ticked off on a checklist of Catholic requirements, that are over and done with once they are celebrated. Sacraments have nothing to do with completing a workbook or memorizing theologies. Faith is not learnt from a textbook. They are introductions, an initiation into a way of life. Sacraments equip us to be missionary disciples, apprentices of Jesus, bringing about the kingdom of God.

There are some basic beliefs that guide the sacramental team’s planning. First and foremost is the understanding that parents are the primary educators of their children in faith. Vatican II affirmed this emphatically. The family is the domestic Church. This is the place where faith in God is planted and nourished; this is the place where love in all its forms is expressed; this is the place where children learn how to love, respect, forgive, show gratitude, ask for forgiveness, wonder at the beauty of creation. We support the parents in their role.

Secondly, sacraments arise from our lived experiences, where all faith grows, and we try to incorporate that into our catechetical program. Our sacramental team will present sessions to parents and parents and children together in ways that their present, lived experience, is linked with the stories, traditions, rites and rituals of our Church. We cannot teach about the Eucharist without first asking about their experience of sharing family meals; nor about Reconciliation with never having experienced forgiveness.

Lastly, we believe that the faith community coming together for its liturgy is where the Gospel is made manifest. The Gospel is heard and lived beyond the gathering. Sacraments are celebrations; they are actions of the community. The symbols, rituals, and signs used in the liturgy are powerful, none more so than those used in the rites of the sacraments: water, oil, bread, wine, anointing, Sign of the Cross, candle, fire etc. The liturgy is always communal, not private, and always calls us to discipleship.

The key question for all of us seems to be: what difference do the sacraments make in our life, regardless of the era in which they were celebrated?

ADULT FAITH - "The Mass": – The **Collection** and the **Presentation of the Gifts** herald the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Here we recognize that everything is God's gift and the gifts (money, bread and wine) that we offer God, are what God has already given us: *through your goodness we have received the bread (wine) we offer you.* Everything we are and have, is God's gift to us. Every situation and circumstance, every material thing we live among, every thought in our minds linked to the love in our hearts owe their existence to God. Our very being comes from Him; without Him we simply would not be, nor would any situation in which we find ourselves – we are utterly dependent. The words "the work of human hands" invite us to remember all the people, including ourselves – a whole production line of people - involved with God in the production of these gifts. Live the Liturgy

I recently decided to learn to cook. As I sit at the feet of various YouTube cooking masters, I notice how much of cooking is adding ingredients that don't provide any more nourishment, like herbs and other seasonings. But man! They make all the difference because they make the meal delightful to eat and share.

Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the world." No one eats just salt. So, Christians are not meant to replace or do away with the world. They are meant to be agents of preservation and glorification. Notice how often these days the Church seeks to preserve what is threatened: the goodness of marital and family love, the desires of young people for greatness, the value of honest work, healthy economics, and altruistic political engagement, the dignity of the poor and vulnerable. Over and over, we say to a world who wants to throw things out, "It's worth saving! We'll preserve it! We'll show you it's wonderful." If we can't engage the world like that, Jesus says we are the ones who get thrown out, because salt alone is worthless.

Jesus only asks us to do for others what he does for us. He is the "salt" of everything in our lives. Is there something in your life starting to rot a bit? Something tasting bland and boring? Let Jesus salt it and see if you like it better.
