PEACE BE WITH YOU

Last weekend we celebrated the Church's great feast of the Holy Spirit, Pentecost. Fifteen members of our parish were present for the launch of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan in Rockhampton with over one hundred others, and many of us walked with other Christians from the Uniting Church to the Anglican Church via Holy Rosary Church on the annual Pentecost Church Crawl. The air was filled, not with tongues of fire or mighty winds, but with excitement and energy. The Spirit was swirling through the People of God.

This week Bishop Michael will be in Bundaberg for a brief Pastoral visit, during which he will confer the sacrament of Confirmation upon fifty-five young people on Tuesday and Thursday nights.

He will greet the children and their families with "Peace be with you", a powerful promise from the Risen Christ to everyone gathered. Archbishop Coleridge once said to a group of confirmation candidates: "If you accept the gifts, open the gifts, not just throw them away or forget about them, and if you use the gifts of the Spirit freely given to you then I promise, you will experience the peace that only Jesus can give." This assurance of peace, a peace the world cannot give, directs us as it was for the apostles, to go out and be "filled with joy", being Christ to others.

I pray that the risen Lord, standing alongside the children, and indeed all of us, bringing his peace and breathing the Holy Spirit upon us, will find us willing to accept the gifts of the Holy Spirit in our lives and to use those gifts to bear fruit in our world.

All liturgies of the Church are communal acts of worship. No liturgy is private. With that in mind feel free to come to either of the Confirmation liturgies next week and pray with their families for these young ones. Your presence will increase the buzz and energy in the church!

ADULT FAITH: *The Mass - The Agnus Dei*

When the exchange of peace has finished, Priest and People say or sing together the **Angus Dei**, another part of the Mass set to music by so many of the great western composers:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace.

Referring to Christ as the *Lamb of God (Agnus Dei)* takes no one by surprise. He is prophesied as the Lamb of God by Isaiah (Isaiah 53:7); pointed out as such by St John the Baptist whose very words the Priest later quotes (Jn 1:29); and referred to frequently by St John in his Apocalypse, where Christ is depicted as a Lion-Lamb, sacrificed to achieve our salvation and risen victoriously to deliver it.

When we pray that the Lamb of God *have mercy on us*, we are asking for all the blessings that he is able to bestow: on our past, present and future actions; on our physical and social well-being; on our spiritual life and our relationship with God; on our eternal salvation. And for this mercy we appeal to the Lion-Lamb who was slain out of love for us but who rose victoriously to devour our death and our iniquities and to give us everything we ultimately need.

Reference to Jesus as the *One who takes away the sins of the world* occurs six times in the Mass: twice in the Gloria, three times here and once when the Priest shows the sacred Host to the people before reception of Holy Communion.

By Christ's death and mercy we live; by his weakness we are strengthened; by his passion we are freed from suffering; by his love, we are granted that *peace that the world cannot give*.

DIOCESAN FESTIVAL

The Diocesan Festival was attended by more than one hundred and twenty parishioners from all parts of the Diocese. Our Diocese covers over 414,000 square kms. Fifteen members from our Bundaberg Parish attended. The twenty-four hours saw the launch of the Diocesan Pastoral Plan. Over the next three weeks, the highlights of that plan will be printed in the Newsletter.

It is a three-fold Call to Action for the whole Diocese. The three calls are: to **evangelise**, to **be co-responsible** and to **celebrate**.

As you ponder the call and reflect on the priorities of each call, you might evaluate where we are as a Parish; where you are as a vital member of this Parish; and, where we might journey together as both Parish and Diocese into the future.

CALL TO ACTION

- **To evangelise**, we continue the great commission given by Jesus to his disciples before he ascended to the Father: “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.” Matthew 28:19

PRIORITIES

- **Active welcome:** Actively welcome every person in the church and wider community and promote opportunities for engagement.
- **Geographical needs:** Advocate for and support communities across the diocese with unique geographical needs and those living in remote rural and mining communities.
- **Pastoral outreach:** Strengthen support for outreach and parish ministries.
- **Reconciliation:** Promote and implement the Diocesan Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP).
- **Initiation:** Guided by the Diocesan Policy ‘Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Diocese of Rockhampton’, implement the process and programs used for the Sacraments of Initiation.
- **Invitation:** Explore strategies to encourage fuller participation in the life of the Church with those who connect for special events.
- **Faith formation:** Provide intentional and ongoing faith formation for all.

Live the Liturgy



this case, I refer to the mystery of a healthy and proper sense of self-love. We human beings (both men and women) have the utterly weird ability to look at ourselves as if we were another. Then we tend to love this “other.” Then, somehow, that love becomes a bond between the two. We are three and yet one.

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. We ponder anew that God in His unity is a play of multiplicity: Lover, Beloved, and shared Love. Or, as we also proclaim, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. If we allow it, this mystery heals our temptation toward self-hatred and destruction. We all know how awful it is to look into the mirror and not know the person we see, or, equally bad, to know and hate who we see. Jesus, the Son of God, draws us into the dynamics of authentic self-knowledge and self-love. Perhaps we could ask the Holy Trinity this Sunday to teach us to truly look at ourselves and to properly love who we see looking back. — Father John Muir

In my experience, one of the peculiarities of being a man is the somewhat unlikely ability to look into the mirror, no matter how out of shape he may be, and declare with full confidence: “Looking good, buddy!” Ask a man. He’ll probably confirm it.

Therein lies a mystery. You might think I refer to man’s ability to deceive himself or his propensity toward vainglory. But in
